Anesthesia Consent Form

Procedure to be preformed _____

I being the owner or authorized agent of the owner, consent to Suburban Animal Hospital anesthetizing my pet for the procedure listed above. I understand that anesthesia involves some risk to my pet. I understand that Suburban Animal Hospital uses reasonable precautions against injury, escape or death of my pet. I understand I assume all risks and expenses.

Pre-Anesthesia Blood Work

A comprehensive blood screen before anesthesia may alert the veterinarian to common abnormalities that affect your pet's ability to tolerate the drugs used for anesthesia. Abnormalities may indicate a need for further testing, postponing the procedure or a change of anesthetic drugs to be used.

Pain Medication

Surgical procedures can be painful. We do our best to estimate the needed pain medication prior to procedure; however, some animals are in more pain than we anticipate. If your pet seems painful, we may give your pet additional pain medication. Cost of this is weight-based and varies between

Dental Extraction(s)

All dentals include radiology. This allows us to assess the teeth under gumline to determine root and tooth health. If unhealthy teeth are identified, then extractions may be recommended.

The cost of extraction(s) varies per tooth depending upon complexity and type tooth removed. **We will not extract any teeth if it is not necessary.**

If you would like a call before extractions, please initial below. We will call you **one** time. If we do not get a hold of you, we will wait 10 min for a response. If you do not call within 10 min, we will **NOT** pull any teeth and extractions will need to be done at another time.

Fluoride Treatment

Fluoride treatment of clean teeth while under anesthesia strengthens enamel and helps resist tartar adhesion.

Microchip #<id>

While your pet is under anesthesia it is an ideal time to implant a microchip in your pet. The microchip, the size of a grain of rice, is implanted under the skin between the shoulders as a permanent form of ID. A microchip will identify your pet if they should be presented to the pound or shelter without their tags.

Histopathology (Mass Removal)

Histopathology is a sample of the mass being removed that is sent out to the lab for testing. This can allow us to get a better picture of what was removed and what implications that might have on treatment moving forward.

Ear Cleaning

With your pet under anesthesia, oftentimes they are more accepting of a thorough cleaning.

*If we are unable to verify your pet is current on required vaccinations, we will booster them.
